Darevskia kamii

AHMADZADEH, FLECKS, CARRETERO,
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Kami's Lizard



Global range: Iran.

Distribution in Iran: Golestan Province.

Biology: Kami's Lizard mainly occurs in wooded areas where it lives on trunks of trees similarly to other species of this genus. The first specimen has been recorded from 450 m a.s.l. This species has been observed in some areas such as the surroundings of Shirabad Cave in Golestan Province along with *Darevskia steineri*.

Size: Snout–vent length 69.5 mm.

Reproduction: Oviparous.

Status: Common.

Conservation status: IUCN: –, CITES: –, National: Non-protected.

Diet: Arachnids and insects.

Activity pattern: Diurnal.
