Darevskia kamii Ahmadzadeh, Flecks, Carretero, Mozaffari, Böhme, Harris, Freitas & Rödder, 2013 Kami's Lizard

Global range: Iran.

Distribution in Iran: Golestan Province.

Biology: Kami's Lizard mainly occurs in wooded areas where it lives on trunks of trees simi-



larly to other species of this genus. The first specimen has been recorded from 450 m a. s. l. This species has been observed in some areas such as the surroundings of Shirabad Cave in Golestan Province along with *Darevskia steineri*.

Size: Snout-vent length 69.5 mm.

Reproduction: Oviparous.

Status: Common.

Conservation status: IUCN: -, CITES: -, National: Non-protected.

Diet: Arachnids and insects. Activity pattern: Diurnal.
